The contractor filed a third-party complaint against the state in Mercer County Superior Court, claiming it was due \$2.36 million in unpaid fees. The state refused to pay because it said the unit failed to perform to specifications, requiring outlays of \$1.5 million for temporary and replacement equipment, says the contractor's lawyer, John Palladino of Hankin Sandman & Palladino in Atlantic City.

M&R's claim was dismissed in February 2010 for failure to provide discovery and to obtain counsel.

After mediation by **Ray Falls**, of Neshanic Station, the state agreed on Feb. 27 to pay Bock \$1.825 million. The payment was made on May 5.
